The Exeter Centre for International Law is delighted to invite you to a conference on “Legal Resilience in an Era of Hybrid Threats” on 8–10 April 2019 at the University of Exeter. The aim of the event is to explore the legal challenges presented by lawfare, hybrid threats and gray zone conflict and to develop the notion of legal resilience as a framework for countering these challenges.

Confirmed speakers include Professor Charlie Dunlap (Duke), Professor Jutta Brunnée (Toronto), Brigadier General (ret) Richard Gross, Professor Melissa de Zwart (Adelaide), Marlene Mazel (Israel, Ministry of Justice) and Professor Geoffrey Corn (South Texas). The programme includes presentations on the Kerch Strait Incident, human shields, information operations, counter-lawfare, passportization, remote warfare, hostilities in outer space and strategies for legal resilience.

The event is held in collaboration with the European Centre of Excellence for Countering Hybrid Threats, the Geneva Centre for Security Policy and the Lieber Institute of the United States Military Academy.
